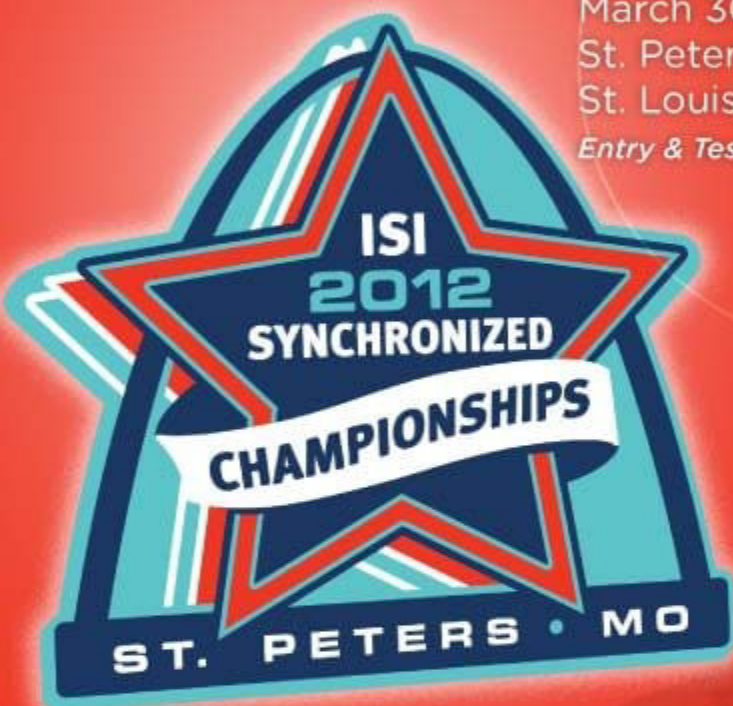

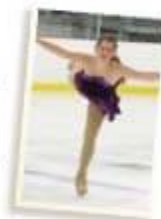

2012 Rule Revisions Update

Please note the following important update to the recently announced 2012 Rule Revisions:

Synchro team skaters are now limited to compete at **one age division lower than their true age division** (for example, a 17-year old Sr. Youth team skater can skate on a Youth team, but not on a Jr. Youth Team). **Skaters can compete in any higher age division category.*** All age divisions still require a **MAJORITY** of skaters — but not every skater — to fit within the age division for that team.

We apologize for any confusion with this new synchro team rule and wish you and your teams a successful synchro season!



* This new sentence is a revised wording change from previously printed versions of the 2012 Rule Revisions. This update information was incorrect in the Rule Revisions

printed in the fall issues of the *EDGE* and *Recreational Ice Skating* and the Instructor Seminar manual; however, this new update will be included in the new 2012 *ISI Handbook* that will be available in December.

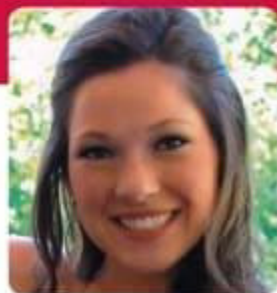

Daniel Kulenkamp: ISI's Newest FS10 Skater

When 16-year-old Daniel Kulenkamp from White Bear Lake Sports Center in Minnesota passed his ISI Freestyle 10 test at Worlds this summer, it was a dream come true — one that he and his coach had shared since Daniel was a Pre-Alpha skater.

Daniel started taking skating lessons when he was 4 years old, and he's been skating ever since. A highly motivated skater and gifted student, Daniel typically skates four hours a day and studies between sessions. He's a Connections Academy student studying chemistry, U.S. History, Spanish and English. He's also enrolled in a talented youth math program at the University of Minnesota, where he studies calculus.

Rose Esteb, who's been Daniel's coach since he was 5, coaches him in ISI and USFS. She describes Daniel as "talented, hard-working, self-motivated, intelligent and probably the nicest, most caring young man you'll ever meet. He is genuine, humble and mature beyond his years. He excels in academics and skating because of his tenacity and perseverance. Even at a young age, I knew his work ethic would take him far."

That work ethic, tenacity, perseverance and talent are what led Daniel to earn his esteemed Freestyle 10 status. "After passing Freestyle 9 and landing my first triple toe loop, I realized that passing Freestyle 10 was possible," Daniel says. "Freestyle 10 is important to me because I always like to finish something that I've started. I wanted to pass because so few people have ever done it."

"The hardest part of passing Freestyle 10 was controlling the nerves I had in the week leading up to the test," he adds. "Once I stepped on the ice, I let my body do what I had trained so hard to do."

Daniel says that one of the highlights of his skating career is the ability to skate both ISI and USFS and to be successful in both. In addition to his ISI accomplishments, he is a three-time Minnesota State Champion (Pre-Juvenile, Intermediate and Novice) and a two-time USFS Junior National competitor.

"Skating gives me something to work hard for," he notes. "I enjoy skating, especially in shows where I can entertain people." He is a frequent guest skater throughout his state and region.

When not skating or studying, Daniel likes to read (especially Harry Potter books), spend time with his family and play the piano. He is supported in his efforts by his parents, grandparents and his brother Grant, who is working on mastering Freestyle 9 and with whom Daniel skates Couple Spotlights.

Daniel advises other ISI skaters who hope to reach the Freestyle 10 level to "work hard and never, never, never give up." As for his goals, he hopes to master the triple Lutz and triple Axel, to continue to compete in both ISI and USFS competitions and to graduate from college.

He says he's grateful to his coach for helping him improve his skating and for keeping it fun and exciting: "Rose is a great role model, and I'm proud to say she is my coach."

Rose praises Daniel for his attitude, optimism and eagerness to learn. "Skating has its ups and downs, and he always tries to see the bright side of things. He teaches in White Bear's learn-to-skate program and does an awesome job. He is a wonderful role model for all the younger skaters. He continues to have fun and work hard — essential for a skater."

ISI congratulates Daniel Kulenkamp on achieving the prestigious Freestyle 10. We look forward to following the promising career of this extraordinary young man. **ISI**

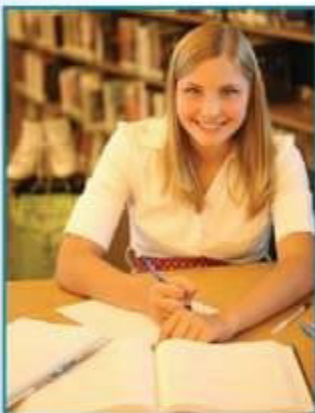

Are You a Skating Scholar?

ISI members are well-rounded individuals who put as much energy into their life off the ice as they do on it. We believe that both educational and recreational pursuits are necessary to achieve a balanced life.

Each year, the ISIA Education Foundation awards scholarships to ISI skaters who have demonstrated a commitment to academics and service. The application process is open to students in their senior year of high school through

their junior year in an undergraduate program. However, most recipients began their qualification process during their middle-school years. Start your four-step process of qualification today.

- 1** Maintain at least a 3.0 GPA.
- 2** Participate in a variety of school and community activities. Keep detailed records, including frequency of participation.
- 3** Continue to test and compete in the ISI program, especially during the two years prior to application. Keep good records of all skating activity.
- 4** Prior to application, complete 120 hours of verified service, of which at least 60 must be in association with an ISI member facility. This information must be recorded on the Service Hours Verification Form, which is part of the scholarship application available at skateisi.org.

March 1**

Team Up for Synchro in the Gateway to the West!

ISI Synchronized Championships returns to the Heartland in 2012, where the friendly folks at St. Peters Rec-Plex are already looking forward to welcoming synchro teams from all over the country to their beautiful facility. Located in a pretty park setting in St. Peters, Mo. (about 30 minutes west of St. Louis) the Rec-Plex is known as the community's crown jewel and a top spot for sports enthusiasts. The complex includes three NHL-size ice rinks and seating for 300-1,200 spectators.

Synchro 2012 will take place March 30-April 1 and feature ISI's new Advanced Formation and Open Skating

event categories. The weekend will also include the third annual Synchro Showcase exhibition on Saturday night.

Advanced Formation is a transitional event between Formation and Skating. Teams still perform all the basic synchro elements: line, circle, block, wheel, intersection — but they can also do 3-turns, Mohawks, backward crossovers and backward chasses.

Open Skating events have no required maneuvers. This event category is for Senior Youth, Teen, Collegiate and Adult age divisions only. See the new 2012 *ISI Handbook* for complete event details.

ISI Skating Program and Event **FAQs**

Knowledge is power! Here's some information to make you a more powerful ISI skater or parent:

Why can't I choose to compete in a higher-level competition event for practice and to get more experience?

All technical Freestyle, Couple and Pair events (except the new Open Freestyle events) compare "apples to apples." If you can do the maneuvers from a higher test level, then you should pass the test and move up to that level. If you are still working on completing all the maneuvers for the next higher test, there are now many options in other events where you can practice higher-level maneuvers to get more experience.

One place is the new Open Freestyle events, where there are no required maneuvers. In 2012, any spin can be performed at any level, but there are still jump limitations in the Bronze, Silver and Gold levels (so make sure you know them). Even though technical skating maneuvers are not judged, other competition events such as Interpretive, Artistic, Spotlight, Footwork and Rhythmic events also allow skaters to perform maneuvers from higher levels, and many of those event groups have combined levels of skaters.

Why are skaters in the Pre-Alpha through Delta levels required to perform one maneuver from Freestyle 1 in their program routine?

While it might seem difficult at first, most beginning skaters really enjoy practicing a beginning 2-foot spin or spiral or even a waltz jump. Jumps and spins are what they see on TV, and practicing a variety of those Freestyle 1 maneuvers can motivate beginners to improve their basic test maneuvers and help them to reach their full skating potential.

Why can the Freestyle 1 spiral be done on either edge (outside or inside) or a flat (in a straight line) but all the spiral requirements in Freestyle 2-4 must be done on edges?

The answer to this one is pretty simple: It's because the Pre-Alpha through Delta skaters don't even learn edges until Delta/Freestyle 1 levels so it's not possible to require only an edge for the lower-level skaters. After Freestyle 1, all spirals must be performed on edges since all eight skating edges are learned by the Freestyle 1 level.

Why do we have to do those dance step sequences on Freestyle 2-9 levels?

Many people think that skating is all about the jumps and spins, but those maneuvers actually last only a fraction of a second or a few seconds in a program routine. What are you going to do in between those highlights? You'd better be able to do more than just jumps and spins — and that's where the dance step sequences come in. They teach you the basic turns and edges needed to progress to higher-level skating maneuvers. They also give you some interesting patterns to do as connecting moves between your jumps and spins. In ISI competitions, many coaches and skaters forget that the dance step sequences actually count the same amount as any jump or spin toward the skater's overall event placement.

Why should I be in the rink at least one hour before my scheduled event warm-up time?

While this can vary from competition to competition, it's still a good guideline (and a requirement for ISI national events). If you are in the rink an hour before, you can check in your music and find out if the events are running on time, late, or even ahead of schedule. While it is rare, some ISI events can run early if all the skaters are there and ready. It also gives you time to get familiar with the building, get ready, relax and do your best performance!

Why didn't I get first place if I was the only one in my event group who didn't fall down?

Did the other skaters fall while performing a required maneuver? If they did, they can get up and do the maneuver again and the fall will not affect the maneuver score. If they fell while performing a maneuver that is

not required, then that fall will not affect their "Extra Content" score.

In short, the only way that a fall could affect the judge's score is if it's done while performing a required maneuver and that maneuver is not repeated, or possibly under the "General Overall" score if the fall(s) detract from the overall skating performance. It is possible to fall and still receive first place in an ISI event.

Why didn't I place higher in the Open Freestyle events when I did more difficult jumps and spins?

Even though this is a technical skating event, there are no required maneuvers. Individual jumps, spins and connecting moves now receive three separate "Correctness" scores. Correctness includes the technical accuracy, or quality, of the maneuvers performed. Difficulty or technical merit is not considered here, but falls are to be taken into consideration when judging.

Why didn't I get first place when my Spotlight prop was so great?

While there is one judge scoring "Costume & Prop", the most important judging criterion is the "Judge Appeal" score given by all three judges. Having a great prop doesn't guarantee a winning program. Did you use your

prop during the routine? Did it add to the theme of your program? Or was it just a prop sitting on the ice? Was the overall performance of the program entertaining and fun to watch? These are some of the questions the judges ask during Spotlight events.

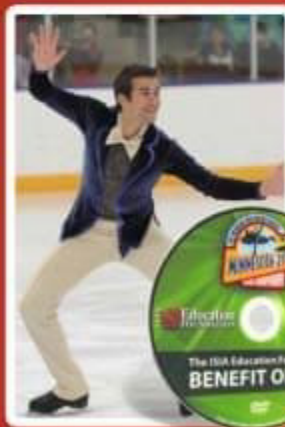
Why can't we see the judges' scores or placements for our competition events?

All ISI competitions are based on a closed system of judging. This is because in most ISI events, each judge has different judging criteria. The combination of the judges' scores is what creates the totals to determine the overall placement results. Just because one judge gives you lower scores doesn't mean they thought you did a bad performance; they just thought the other skaters turned in a better performance for that one particular judging criterion.

For all ISI recreational competitions, the largest event group is nine entries. Skaters not placing in first through fifth place will receive sixth place (there are no seventh, eighth or ninth places). This philosophy helps all skaters have a more positive competitive experience, allowing them to receive a medal for their performance in every event while they still earn participation points for their overall rink team. **RIS**



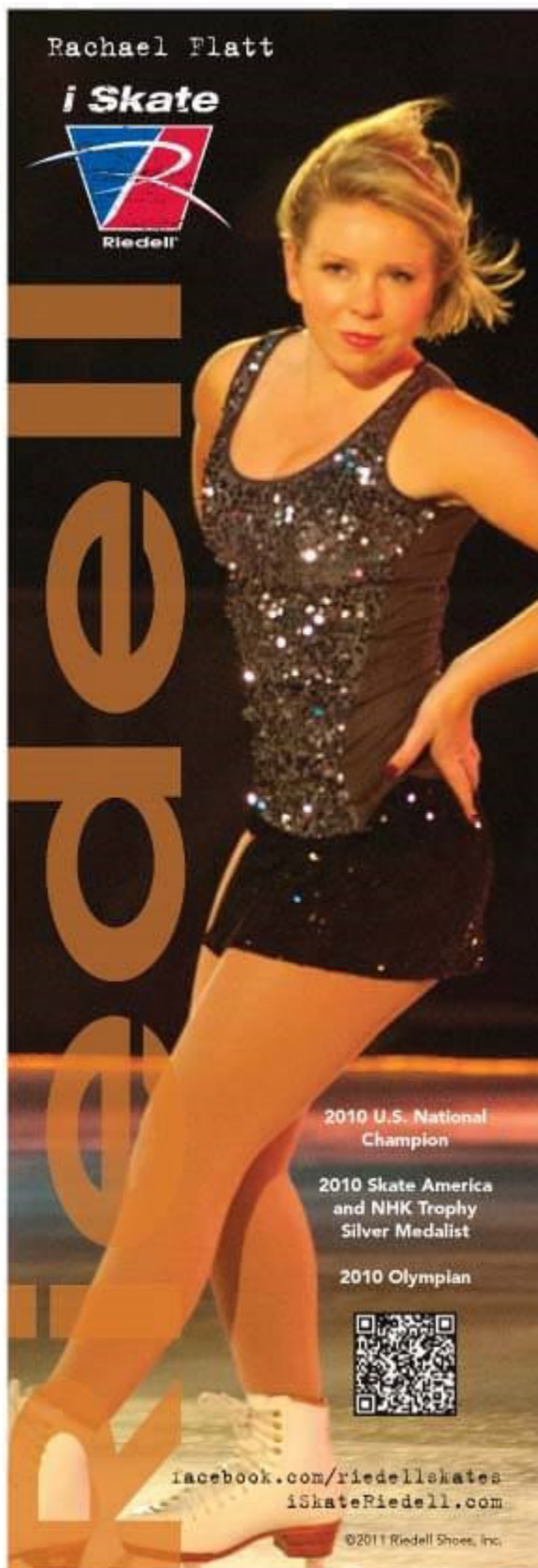

The annual Skate Asia competition is lauded as the largest gathering of international ice skaters in Asia as well as THE event that keeps Asian skaters connected in their sport. Last August, 662 skaters from 11 countries representing 25 rinks connected with one another as they gathered in Bangkok, Thailand, for the 12th annual Skate Asia. The Jackson Ultima Skate Asia 2011 was held at Imperial World Ice Skating Center.

Travelers to Bangkok were treated to warm and generous Thai hospitality by the host committee, chaired by Suroj Lamsam, as well as all those who worked tirelessly to make the competition a memorable experience for all. The competition ran smoothly due to the leadership of competition director and chief referee Paul Tai Wai Wong and a wonderfully pleasant, upbeat group of staff and volunteers.

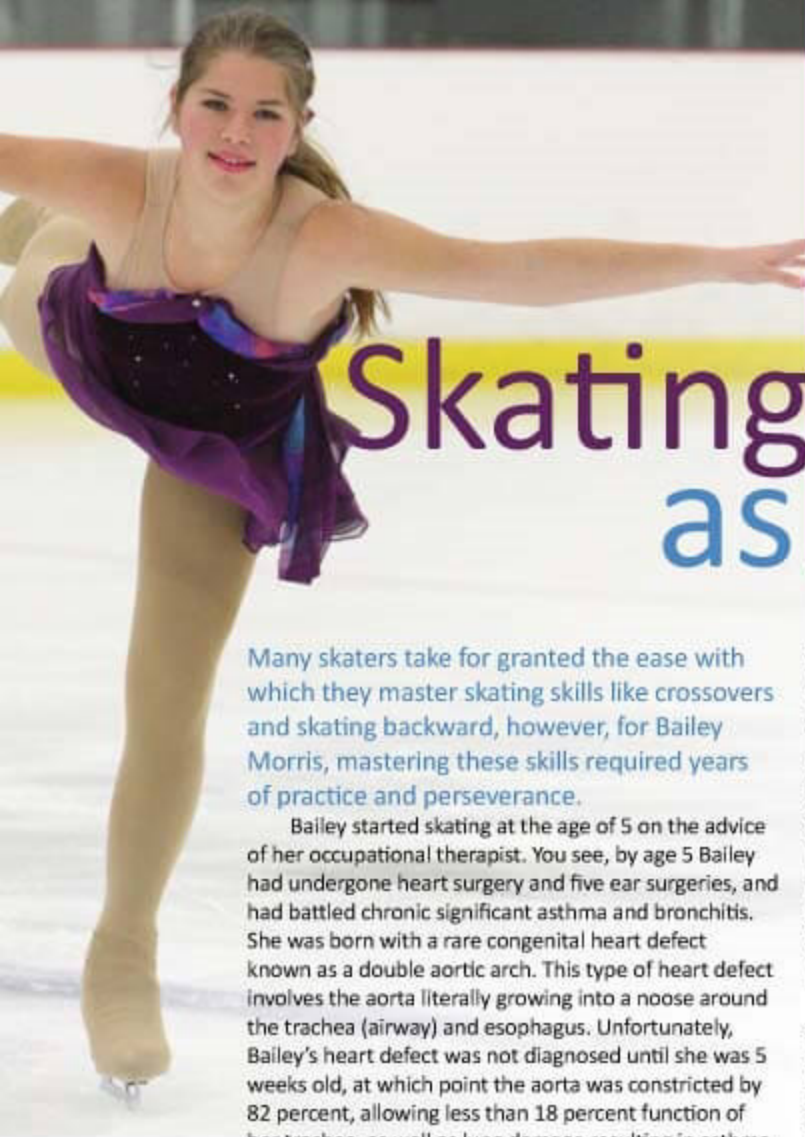

Skating as Therapy

Many skaters take for granted the ease with which they master skating skills like crossovers and skating backward, however, for Bailey Morris, mastering these skills required years of practice and perseverance.

Bailey started skating at the age of 5 on the advice of her occupational therapist. You see, by age 5 Bailey had undergone heart surgery and five ear surgeries, and had battled chronic significant asthma and bronchitis. She was born with a rare congenital heart defect known as a double aortic arch. This type of heart defect involves the aorta literally growing into a noose around the trachea (airway) and esophagus. Unfortunately, Bailey's heart defect was not diagnosed until she was 5 weeks old, at which point the aorta was constricted by 82 percent, allowing less than 18 percent function of her trachea, as well as lung damage resulting in asthma.

Bailey's oxygen deprivation left her with systemic low muscle tone. In addition to six years of occupational therapy, she also had five years of speech therapy due to chronic ear infections that impaired both her speech and hearing, and poor muscle tone in her tongue, which made her speech hard to understand. In addition, Bailey suffers from an integration subtype auditory processing disorder that was not diagnosed until she was 10, which means that the right and left sides of her brain don't "talk to each other."

Bailey began skating shortly after her 5th birthday at the then Oxnard Ice Skating Center (now known as the Channel Islands Ice Skating Center). At first, she had asthma flare-ups due to the cold air inside the ice rink, but over time these subsided as her lung capacity grew. She was blessed to have Michelle Wilkin as her first private ice skating coach, who patiently worked with her on her basic skills. Bailey loved ice skating from the beginning and was always trying to copy what the older skaters were doing. Even though she couldn't skate

backward, Bailey would periodically surprise Michelle with a waltz jump, a new spin or some other trick she had copied.

It took Bailey a year and a half to pass the Beta level due to the backward crossovers, and another year and a half to pass Freestyle 1 due to the back edges, both of which involved crossing the uncomfortable mid-line of Bailey's body. But she never gave up and with a great deal of practice she eventually mastered these skills. Many new skating friends passed her by in skating skills and competition levels, eventually even skaters who had started years after her.

After being diagnosed as borderline Type 2 diabetic at age 9 and getting her blood sugar balanced, Bailey's stamina took off. This was a rough time for her coaches, who had to weather many blood sugar-induced mood swings, and many thanks are due to Wendy Lewis and Terry Tonius for their patience during this time.

Throughout the years, Bailey has consistently skated at ISI competitions, including: Worlds in 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2011; Artistic Challenge in 2008; and Winter Classic in 2010. In the 2010 Winter Classic she finished second out of nine skaters in the Freestyle 3 technical program event choreographed by her new coach, former national Junior Pairs champion Colette Appel. In late 2010 Bailey passed her USFS Pre-Preliminary moves test and learned how to do an Axel. She is currently competing at Freestyle 4 and/or in the ISI Silver Open category.

Without ISI ice skating, Bailey would not be the person she is today. While ice skating has presented many personal challenges to Bailey over the years, it has also allowed her to develop at her own pace and taught her the rewards of hard work and perseverance. As Bailey skates into her seventh year in ISI, her love of skating continues to grow, and she is looking forward to learning her double jumps and competing in Worlds next July. **ISI**



Rink *Relationships*

- Keep the ice frozen, the lights on and the doors open with a consistent ice schedule.
- Inform customers, staff and coaches whenever there is any problem with the first point.
- Monitor job performance and train quality rink staff in the safe and friendly operation of the facility.
- Maintain a good working relationship with rink staff, coaches, parents and skaters.
- Create a friendly skating environment that promotes positive learning and teamwork.

Rink Staff

- Be on time for work shifts.
- Have a pleasant attitude.
- Take responsibility for things that need to be done.
- Be on the lookout for potential problems or concerns.
- Provide correct information to customers.

Coaches

- Be on time for lessons, but inform your customers and the rink as soon as possible if you will be late or absent.
- Conduct high quality lessons.
- Maintain high professional and ethical standards.
- Keep open communication with parents and students.
- Strive to upgrade your coaching standards and education.

Parents

- Be on time for lessons, but inform your customers and the rink as soon as possible if you will be late or absent.
- Follow rink rules for classes and sessions.
- Pay for ice time and lessons as they are given.
- Keep open communication with your coach and rink.
- Avoid gossip and rumors. Instead, search for facts and information that will create a positive learning environment.

Students

- Concentrate and pay attention during lesson times.
- If you like to skate, show your parents by the way you practice.
- Ask your coach questions if you don't understand what you are trying to do.
- Be courteous and respectful of all skating students, coaches and rink staff.

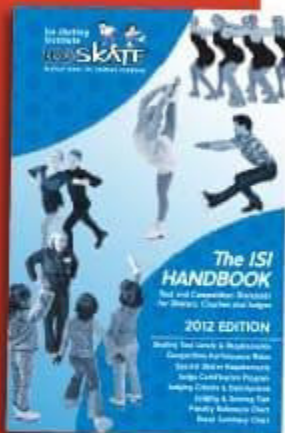
